The Huntingdon Regional Fire Rescue is starting the annual fund drive. You will be receiving our solicitation letter soon. We appreciate your continued support of this important event. Oneida Township has continued its support by providing a \$ 7,000 dollar cash donation and in kind support worth approximately \$15,000 in use of the township building as our district 18 station. They also pay \$1,561 as the township share of worker's compensation and \$2,541 as their share of the vehicle insurance. The operating budget for this year for HRFR is \$ 490,000. Municipal support accounts for 20 percent of this budget. The rest is provided by your support of our fund raising events throughout the year. As you can see this is a sizable undertaking so we may continue to provide the best fire protection possible.

Basis Care of Grinder Pumps 101



In the event the pump alarm should go off signaling a problem with the system, **KEEP WATER USAGE TO A MINIMUM.** This is also the case in the event of a power outage.

Power to the unit should not be disconnected, but if the alarm should sound, it may be silenced by pushing the rubber toggle button on the bottom of the box on the outside of the house.

The following materials should NOT be introduced to the sewer system either directly or indirectly via a kitchen waste disposal unit: Glass, Metal, Goldfish stone, Seafood shells, Plastic objects (i.e. toys, utensils, etc.), Sanitary napkins, tampons, Diapers, socks, rags, Kitty litter, Lubricating oil or Grease.

Also, these materials should NEVER be put into a sewer system: Explosives, Flammable material, Strong chemicals, Gasoline.
