

ONEIDA TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS' MEETING  
AUGUST 4, 2021 7:30 PM  
ONEIDA TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL BUILDING

PRESENT: John Skipper, Stephen Magill, Henry Strong, Chris Carper, John Morningstar, Doris Hayden

OPENING: Mr. Skipper opened the meeting with the "Pledge of Allegiance".

VISITORS' COMMENTS: Mr. Morningstar was present to ask about putting a trailer on a lot zoned B-2 on Route 26. It would require extending the sewer line along Route 26. At this point, we explained that we have contacted the Huntingdon Sewer Authority to see if that is feasible. We also are looking into the zoning aspect of it which may involve a variance hearing to allow the trailer to be put there. We will continue to seek answers and will let him know as soon as we do, what his options are.

MINUTES/FINANCIAL REPORTS: Mr. Strong reported that the first have of the ARPA money is in and has been transferred to its own interest-bearing account. The interest generated from the account will be ours to keep. At some point in the near future, part of that money will be transferred back to the General Fund to make up the loss of revenue from Cov-id19. Mr. Skipper motioned to approve the minutes and financial reports from last month and it was seconded by Mr. Magill.

ROADMASTER'S REPORT: Mr. Carper gave a brief report on work done this month. Storm clean-up was done on a couple of the roads as well as shoulder work. The deflectors were added to the recent guide rail that was done.

OLD BUSINESS: We are still looking for a Code Enforcement Officer. A couple of people have been contacted and answers are pending.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. Magill motioned to approve **Resolution 2021-04** which sets up the destruction of specific records in the future. It was seconded by Mr. Skipper.

Mr. Magill then motioned to approve **Resolution 2021-05** which specifies what records will be destroyed. It was seconded by Mr. Skipper.

The Township has written a letter to PennDot asking for a speed limit study on a portion of Cold Springs Road. We have received a letter stating that that as been approved and will occur in the next couple of months. A copy of the letter will be sent to Mrs. Roz Cunningham, who lives off of Cold Springs Road and had requested the study be done.

Mr. Magill motioned to adjourn the meeting and it was seconded by Mr. Skipper.
