

ONEIDA TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS' MEETING

MARCH 2, 2022 7:30 PM

ONEIDA TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL BUILDING

PRESENT: John Skipper, James Ferrenberg, Stephen Magill, Henry Strong, Chris Carper, Darlene Shope, Doris Hayden

OPENING: Mr. Skipper opened the meeting with the "Pledge of Allegiance".

VISITORS' COMMENTS: Ms. Shope reported on the 2021 Township audit that was completed last month. There were no findings.

There was a meeting with William Hill and Associates about the computer program for the Sewer System. Mr. John Golanoski came and spoke on how much the system would cost and what could be done depending on the amount allotted. The Township would be able to decide how much it could spend and that would determine how much could be done. He also acknowledged that at this time AARP money could not be used to buy the program. No decision was made at that time.

MINUTES/FINANCIAL REPORTS: Mr. Strong reported that we would have the ability to pay off the PIB loan as early as next year, but it would deplete our Investments. We would still have access to the Sewer account and the AARP money if needed. Mr. Strong also reminded the Supervisors that EIT money was down and inflation has risen sharply. Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to approve the minutes and financial report from last month and it was seconded by Mr. Magill.

ROADMASTER'S REPORT: Antiskid is still being mixed, snow and ice are still an issue.

OLD BUSINESS: The Supervisors were given a Thank you note from the Huntingdon County Humane Society for this year's contribution.

The Supervisors agreed not to advertise Clean-Up Days in The Daily News, since it is on the website, roadside sign and will be in the Newsletter.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to approve the Newsletter for next month and it was seconded by Mr. Skipper.

Mr. Magill thought it would be better for the Township if we did not do a road project this year, but built up the money in Liquid Fuels.

A discussion ensued about the possibility of setting credit card limits on purchasing new equipment. No new policy was decided at this time. It was also stated that at this time we do have accounts with NAPA, Fisher Auto Parts, US Municipal and Chemung.

Other points of discussion included, price of fuel, truck parking at the township building and the addition of more sewer hookups in the Moore subdivision.
