

ONEIDA TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS' MEETING

APRIL 6, 2022 7:30 PM

ONEIDA TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL BUILDING

PRESENT: John Skipper, James Ferrenberg, Stephen Magill, Henry Strong, Doris Hayden

OPENING: Mr. Skipper opened the meeting with the "Pledge of Allegiance".

VISITORS' COMMENTS: None

MINUTES/FINANCIAL REPORTS: Mr. Strong reported that EIT money is starting to catch up from the first of the year. Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to approve the minutes and financial reports from last month and it was seconded by Mr. Magill.

ROADMASTER'S REPORT: Work was done cleaning up ditches, antiskid, limbs and picking up guide rail for road project.

OLD BUSINESS: Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to approve using Liquid Fuels money to put in new guide rail on Old Hawn Road. It was seconded by Mr. Magill. The work is to be done in April.

Mr. Strong reported that Liquid Fuels money came in at less than previous start by just over \$1000. We ended up receiving \$48,664.36.

Mr. Mark Stewart has not complied with the letter to remove the junk from his property within the 90 days. The Supervisors agreed it was time to move on with the next step in writing up a citation. Mr. Magill motioned to approve going forward with the citation and it was seconded by Mr. Ferrenberg.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. Skipper agreed to call Keller Engineering about the bill we received for the presentation on Sewer mapping.

The results of the traffic study by PennDot on Cold Springs Road resulted in a lowering of the Speed Limit from 55 to 45 mph. PennDot will supply and put up the proper signage.

The Supervisors were given the PSATS reports for the coming conference on changes in by-laws, resolutions and nominations.

Mr. Ferrenberg reported that Mr. Terry Hawn is willing to use his equipment to clear out the ditches and shoulders at a cost of around \$1000. Mr. Magill motioned to approve having Mr. Hawn clean out the ditches. It was seconded by Mr. Ferrenberg.

The Secretary will set up a meeting in May with Mr. Ed Habbershon and Ms. Chris Shook to go over updating the Zoning Ordinance.

The Supervisors will look into updating the membership of the Zoning Hearing Board.

Mr. Skipper motioned to approve paying the Tax Collector's dues to the county at \$15. It was seconded by Mr. Ferrenberg.

Mr. Skipper then asked who will be at Clean-Up Days, wanting to make sure there would be enough people.

Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to adjourn the meeting and it was seconded by Mr. Skipper.
