

ONEIDA TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS' MEETING
AUGUST 7, 2024 7:30 PM
ONEIDA TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL BUILDING

PRESENT: James Ferrenberg, John Skipper, John (Andy) Los, Henry Strong, Chris Carper, Phil Hawkins, Sandra Norris, Sergeant Sean Hoffman, Sarah Hayden

OPENING: Mr. Skipper opened the meeting with the "Pledge of Allegiance".

VISITORS' COMMENTS: Sergeant Sean Hoffman from the Pennsylvania State Police stated that he tries to attend a few township meetings a month just to see if there are any issues. He reported that while the number of vehicle crashes in the area remains about the same, the number of citations has tripled in the last year. The supervisors thanked him for coming and expressed their gratitude for all the state police does.

MINUTES/FINANCIAL REPORTS: Mr. Strong stated with interest rates expected to drop in the near future, he may switch the township's 3-month CD with Mid Penn Bank to a 6-month CD, and move some money from the Oneida Reserve Account into a fixed rate investment.

Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to approve the minutes and financial reports from last month and it was seconded by Mr. Los.

ROADMASTER'S REPORT: Mr. Carper reported that in addition to normal mowing this month, he mowed the stretch on Gorsuch Road for Henderson Township, the seal coating was completed by Russell Standard, and 1 grinder pump was replaced.

HRFR REPORT: HRFR was unable to attend the meeting.

OLD BUSINESS: Mr. Skipper stated that there is an opening on the Oneida Township Planning Commission that needs to be filled if anyone is interested.

NEW BUSINESS: Mrs. Hayden presented the supervisors with the paperwork for the Crile/Bonrisco subdivision. The plans were approved by the Huntingdon County Planning Commission and the Oneida Township Planning Commission with no issues. Mr. Ferrenberg made a motion to approve the Crile/Bonrisco subdivision. Mr. Los seconded the motion.

Mr. Ferrenberg shared a quote he received for a new dump truck from US Municipal, totaling \$108,363.00. He stated that he is still waiting on other estimates.

Mr. Skipper stated that the supervisors received the Huntingdon Water and Sewer Authority quarterly meeting minutes from Ray Myers. Mr. Myers notes stated that rates are expected to increase in 2025, and that his term on the Authority expires at the close of 2024. Mr. Ferrenberg motioned to reappoint Ray Myers to the Huntingdon Area Water and Sewer Authority for 2025. Mr. Los seconded the motion.

Mr. Los motioned to adjourn the meeting and it was seconded by Mr. Ferrenberg.
